You can park in the student car park on the orientation day. The Harris Centre is a short 2 minute walk from the Main Car Park and there will be clear signage and guides to help you find your way. The course runs from September 18th, 2023 to the last teaching day of May 24th, 2024. You will be able to access a full timetable for your course on the ALO site during the induction day. All teaching is delivered at the HE Student University Centre.

Module Specifications and reading lists will be available on ALO as we are keen to operate in an environmental way and so will provide a lot of digital resources or links to material online.



An important part of your studies is the development of personal and professional skills. Each year you will be required to set personal and professional goals and develop these through opportunities working in the field and/or participating in workshops and a variety of short courses. This will give you invaluable experiences in your specialism. Tutors will guide you through different placement opportunities during your Development of Personal and Professional Skills Module.

During your studies you will have the opportunity to attend practical sessions with the animal collection at Merrist Wood College. To be allowed to work in the animal facilities you will have to wear protective clothing. Minimum requirement is long trousers and/or shorts (for example, cargo type trousers) and a polo shirt. You will also need protective footwear (for example, hiking boots or wellington boots - no trainers allowed).

You will have access to a digital Activate Learning HE Student Handbook and a Programme Handbook specific to your FdSc studies. Both can be accessed through our online ALO canvas (you will be shown these during Induction). The HE Portal provides details of HE study at Activate Learning. This includes links to the support services available such as HE study skills, bursaries, hardship funds and well-being as well as campus maps and other useful information.
